**SYLLABUS AND RULES FOR ENTRANCE EXAMINATION OF  
LL.B. (TDC) FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2024-25**

For the purpose of admissions in LL.B. Programme of Faculty of Law, Jai Narain Vyas University will conduct “**Jai Narain Vyas University Three Year Degree Law Entrance Tests**” (hereinafter referred to as *JNVU-TDLET (TDC)*). Admissions will be made according to merit of the *JNVU-TDLET (TDC)*, eligibility requirements for entrance test and availability of seats are as under:

**LL.B. (Three Year Scheme)** also known as regular course

**Duration of the Course:** Three years (Annual Scheme)

**No. of Seats:** 320 (GAS- As per BCI approval)

**Minimum Eligibility Criteria**

As per BCI and University rules, an applicant, who has graduated (10+2+3) (UG) or post graduated (10+2+3+2)(PG) in any discipline of knowledge from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State legislature or an equivalent National Institutions recognized as a deemed to be University or Foreign University recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by a Competent Authority with minimum percentage of not below 45% of the total marks in case of General Category applicant, 40% of the total marks in case of SC/ST applicants and 42% for OBC candidate will be eligible for appearing in entrance examination for admission.

However, candidates appearing in the Final Year of the Qualifying Examination may also apply and appear in the Entrance Examination. Such candidate will be required to produce the original mark sheet of the qualifying examination at the time of counseling for getting admission.

If the applicant has passed the qualifying Exam where grades are awarded and:

- A) where the Grade Sheet does not mention the equivalent percentage of marks from grade points, the candidate should submit such a Certificate of conversion from the concerned Institution mentioning either the converted percentage, or the formula for the actual conversion of grade point average to percentage of marks;
- B) where the Grade Sheet itself mentions the equivalent percentage of marks from grade points, or the formula for such conversion, the candidate should get both sides of the Degree/Grade Sheet photocopied showing the equivalent percentage of marks/conversion formula.

“**Aggregate** percentage of marks” will **also** include grace marks awarded to a candidate. **However, it will not** include the marks of those subjects where only pass marks are required such as compulsory language, compulsory environmental studies etc. and which do not contribute to the total in the final (degree) mark sheet. Similarly marks of additional subject (if any) for improvement of aggregate percentage/division will not be considered for calculating the aggregate percentage for admission in the University. Decision of the University in regards to such calculation shall be final.

No rounding off of percentage of marks will be permitted.

### **Reservation and Relaxation Rules**

Reservation and Relaxation in Minimum Eligibility for SC/ST/OBC/SOBC/EWS/ Specially Abled (Divyang) Candidates etc. will be provided as per University Rules for Government Approved (Regular) Seats only. 03 percent seats will be reserved for Wards of the employees of the JNV University.

### **Examination Scheme:**

There shall be one paper of 120 minutes duration carrying 300 marks containing 100 multiple-choice questions.

**Entrance test Centre:** Jodhpur Only.

### **Evaluation & Result:**

Three marks shall be awarded for each correct answer while one mark shall be deducted for each incorrect answer and un-attempted question will be awarded zero mark. Candidate shall be selected in order of merit on the basis of aggregate marks secured in the Entrance Test *JNVU-TDLET (TDC)* provided he/she fulfils the minimum eligibility criteria. ### **Entrance Test Fee:**

Entrance Test Fee for SC and ST is Rs. 1000/- and for others it is Rs. 1200/- Fee will be non refundable on non appearance in JNVU-TDLET (TDC).

**Note : In matters not covered above the University rules will be followed.**
